**Photo Descriptions**

**Slide 12:**

**Photo Description: The clerk at left describes an object; an SSP at the right is relaying information to the DB client, in the middle, via TASL in a hardware store.**

**Slide 13:**

**Photo Description: In the middle, both hands of the DB client lightly grasp over the SSP's hands while the SSP demonstrates the details and placement of the object, via TASL.**

**Slide 15:**

**Photo Description: An SSP explains to the DB client the orientation of the room they just came in, using the sign, "door."**

**Slide 16:**

**Photo Description: An SSP uses the DB client's hand as a tactile map to orient the DB person where she is in the room.**

**Slide 20:**

**Photo Description:** Using tactile sign language and seated on a bench outside, a SSP explains the view of the water and mountains to a DB client.

**Slide 23:**

**Photo Description:** Outside on a seated bench, another SSP explains or converses with the DB client.

**Slide 24:**

**Photo Description:** Up-close photo of the use of tactile sign language in action, a DB client's left palm touches lightly on the SSP's right hand as the SSP conveys information with both hands.

**Slide 26:**

**Photo Description (left):** Two people use both hands to communicate and listen back and forth.

**Photo Description (right):** An up-close view of two people's hands communicating in tactile sign language.

**Slide 29:**

**Photo Description: Two people are seated opposite each other; one person's leg is in between the other person's legs.**

**Slide 30:**

**Photo Description: Two people are seated in chairs facing opposite each other, but side-by-side.**
